Niat Tenaga Kerja Indonesia (TKI) Di Jawa Tengah dalam Upaya Mencegah Tertular HIV dan AIDS

ABSTRACT

Background: The Indonesia migrant workers including community groups are highly vulnerable to HIV and AIDS, particularly female workers aspirant. The migrant workers, especially of female have experiencing various violations of their rights as human beings. They are at risk of various types of crimes such as violence, prostitution, human trafficking, until the infected various types of infectious diseases due to risky sexual relationships, including HIV/AIDS. The purpose of this study is to determine the intention of Indonesian Migrant Workers (TKI) of Central Java in efforts to prevent HIV and AIDS infection.

Method: This was an explanatory research, with cross-sectional type and both of quantitative (survey methods) and qualitative approaches. The respondents in this study was Indonesian Migrant Workers (TKI) that has been working abroad.

Result: The results of research indicated that 60% of respondents intended to prevent HIV and AIDS infections and 90% of respondents had less knowledge about HIV and AIDS. Half the respondents said having good experience in their workplaces/employers, susceptibility perceptions was 53.3%, gravity perception was 56.7%, effective response perception was 63.3%, self-ability perception was 53.3%, the supporting colleague factor was 66.7%, the benefits to provide training was 63.3%, and the influence of supporting health tests was 63.3%. There are three factors that simultaneously affecting to workers intention in preventing HIV and AIDS including perception about gravity of HIV and AIDS has 79.528 times greater than they have perception about not critical, the factor of supporting colleagues had 33.724 times greater than the colleagues who did not support and marital status of have married has 14.609 times greater than the they had unmarried.
